Job Title:	Gymnastics Coach
Hours:	Your normal hours will be 3.45pm to 5.45pm each Wednesday during term time.
Salary:	£30-£35 per hour, subject to qualifications and experience, Term Time only, 2 hours per week

Overview:	The Gymnastics Coach role is key in supporting pupils to achieve their best in gymnastics

Role will include but not be limited to the following duties:

Responsibilities

General:

- To work as part of the Gymnastics Team, supporting the development and delivery of a high quality gymnastics programme
- Supporting our most able girls, aged 7-11 years, in developing their gymnastics skills
- Developing new routines and choreography, which requires an understanding of artistic floor, music, movement, and teamwork
- Confidence in supporting the girls as they develop their vaulting
- Work positively and co-operatively with the Head Coach in leading warm ups and planning training sessions
- Observing and evaluating pupils' progress and providing feedback to each child regarding their performance
- Give feedback pastorally and regarding progress/ability
- Preparing pupils for competition by teaching them new routines and providing them with support and motivation
- Motivating pupils to work hard during coaching sessions and competitions setting an example of good sportsmanship
- Any other duties as reasonably required by the Head of PE and Games
- Promoting and safeguarding the welfare of children and young persons for whom you are responsible and come into contact with

Pupils and Parents:

- To be able to set clear targets, based on prior attainment, for pupils' learning
- Ensure the effective dissemination of information, regarding pupils' progress, to the Head of PE
- Liaise with parents as required on the development, progress and attainment of pupils

Liaison and Events:

- Liaise with Head of PE, as required, regarding the preparation of the facilities and programme for hosted events
- The job holder is expected to make themselves available to external competitions e.g. ISGA and IAPS

Qualifications and Experience:

- Level 1 British Gymnastics General/Gymnastics qualification OR equivalent, Level 2 OR equivalent would be desirable.
- Artistic floor coaching experience would be desirable.
- Knowledge of ISGA / IAPS competition requirements desirable.
- K /u of set floor, set vault desirable.
- A nationally recognised sports coaching qualification in gymnastics and/or netball would desirable).
- Experienced in the creation of floor routines.
- Experience of attending competitions, attending ISGA/IAPS desirable.
- First Aid qualification would be desirable.

Skills:

- Good IT skills and familiarity with the full range of Microsoft products
- Engaging teaching style that is inclusive but also challenges and extends more able pupils

Attributes:

- Motivating and enabling others.
- Developing and evaluating procedures, which promote high standards of gymnastics
- Ability to build effective working relationships with staff and pupils
- Have good communication and interpersonal skills
- Flexibility in approach to people and working arrangements
- Effective time management
- Patience and good humour
